Jenny gives shape to curvy quilts and this is a fittingly meandering journey about Jenny's development as a maker. Her life started in a 70s Sweden with rag rugs and hand-painted bark



baskets, went to London and a fashion industry that demands that you step up on the orange, to a Yorkshire full of Drunkard's Path quilts with holes and dowels.

It is also a story about the evolution of the curve and how this simple shape is picked up, experimented with, and then either discarded (natural selection) or survives to become a building block for something (if Jenny has her way) more elaborate perhaps.

Jenny would say the curve evolves independently and is taking her on a journey rather than the other way around. After this talk, you can judge for yourselves.
