Prior to joining the meeting, we ask that you turn off any computer notifications you have (on your email account, for example) so we won't have dinging and donging going on during the meeting.



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

The Secret Codes: African Nova Scotian Quilts brings together historic and contemporary quilts from makers connected to Nova Scotia, embodying the stories and voices of the community. Curated by David Woods, this exhibition includes more than 35 quilts and a selection of 8 paintings that highlight the various functions of quilts over time: as decorated blankets in the home, as possible codes of communication for enslaved people seeking freedom, as records of family history, as a celebration of Black women and culture, and as inspiration for other art forms.





Community Quilting Chair Anne M.

Thank you to everyone who has been diligently working on quilts, tops and blocks for CQ this past month! I can't thank specific people, because I'm currently in the sunshine state and haven't seen the donations, but I'm looking forward to seeing what people have been up to once I return home in March.



We did, however, make a donation in early February.

Twenty children's quilts were donated to New Circles Community Services (see more information about New Circles in the section about our May meeting, below), who will give them to clients with new babies.

Please remember that our March meeting will be on-line, but we still want to keep our CQ program going. You can use our in-person and drop off locations to pick up quilt sandwiches, a kit, or drop off finished quilts for CQ. There is more need than ever in our community!

About our community quilting program:

We currently have THREE groups that meet in person from September to June at community centres or other locations in Toronto. At least one of these groups continues (at a different location) during the summer months.

The Monday in person group meets every Monday (with a few cancellations for holidays or other events) at Stan Wadlow Community Clubhouse, located at 373 Cedarvale Avenue, Toronto, from 9:00 to 3:30. Members bring their own sewing machines, projects and supplies, but there a usually a few kits available for someone who wants a new project. There's a kettle for tea, and people usually bring a lunch.

The Tuesday in person group meets every Tuesday with a few cancellations for holidays or other events) at East York Community Centre, located at 1081-1/2 Pape Ave., Toronto, from 9:30 to 2:15. There are a few Guild owned sewing machines there, and members typically work on guild projects, like sandwiching tops, making backs, or other projects. Again, there's a kettle for tea, a microwave for warming things up, and people usually bring a lunch.

Our newest in person group is located at 200 Madison Avenue (enter through glass doors off MacPherson Avenue), Toronto, and runs on Thursdays from 12:00 to 4:00. In addition to being open to members, this meeting is open to residents of 200 Madison and neighbouring buildings, the hope being that people will come to learn different sewing techniques. There are three Guild owned sewing machines there, and members typically work on projects under the guidance of Janet P. and Mical P. Again, there's a kettle for tea and a microwave for warming things up.

There's an expectation that people who attend one of the in person sessions will spend at least half of their time working on CQ projects, but anyone is welcome to drop in to have the group help to sandwich a quilt of any kind (we have raised tables to work on, so it's much easier!), to drop off finished items, or even just to have a chat. For people who are new to quilting, coming to some of these sessions is a great way to learn new skills from experienced quilters and designers.

COMMUNITY QUILTING

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We also have two online Sew-Alongs each week, on Tuesdays and Saturdays; these run throughout the year, with few cancellations. People work on personal or CQ projects at home while talking to other members...it's amazing what one can learn at these sessions! These sessions were started during the pandemic, and were intended to be more of a social opportunity for our members; they're a great way for out of town members to stay in touch and for new members to connect with other members.

During the pandemic, we set up drop off and pick up locations at several members homes in different locations in the city, to help keep our CQ program running, and we're still keeping these locations going. People can generally pick up a quilt sandwich or kit at these locations, or can drop off finished items. The locations and contact information are set out on the previous page; please contact the member you want to visit, in order to arrange an appropriate time.

Do You Have Orphan Blocks Hanging Around Your Home? Get Ready for Community Quilting Night!

At our May Guild meeting, we'll be having our Community Quilting night. Instead of sitting theatre style, watching presentations and listening to lectures, you'll be able to sit with new and old friends at round tables, doing hand sewing (bring your sewing kits), eating delicious cookies, and maybe winning a prize! You'll also get to watch a power point presentation of photos of lots of the quilts donated to CQ over the past year.

This year, we have a unique project for everyone to work on.

New Circles Community Services, a clothing bank and service provider in the east end, put out a call for reusable shopping bags in its December newsletter, to be used by their clients to take home their clothing from New Circles, and for their clients' future use for shopping purposes.



We're delighted to say that the Guild is going to help them out at our May Community Quilting evening!

Bring your beautiful orphan blocks (between 6 and 10 inches finished) to our May meeting, and you can then applique them to plain cotton bags purchased by the Guild for this purpose. If you want to add additional embroidery elements to the bags, feel free!

After the meeting, these beautifully decorated bags will be delivered to New Circles, where they will undoubtedly be treasured by their clients for years to come!

If you have extra orphan blocks that you don't mind donating to the cause (Mini Mod blocks, anyone?), feel free to bring them in and they can be used by those of us who don't yet have a stash of orphan blocks. We'll also have some blocks that have been acquired by CQ over the past year or so, so if you don't have orphan blocks, or want to save them for your own projects, we'll have something for you to work with.

If you can't make the May meeting, but still want to participate in this worthy project, you can mail blocks in to us before the meeting, or you could even make your own shopping bag that evening and send it to us after the meeting. Items can be mailed to Anne M. at 108 Chudleigh Avenue, Toronto, M4R 1T6.

If we end up with extra orphan blocks, don't worry! We'll save them for the next Guild Quilt Show, for sale in the shop; they're one of the Guild Shop's best sellers!

We will be showcasing the disappearing blocks that members have made, some using technology to mock up quilt designs. Since this is all done virtually using zoom, we are asking any interested members to create Disappearing Blocks in their home sewing studios and email us these 3 in-process photos before **March 10th**.

- 1st photo of the simple traditional, starter block
- 2nd photo of the cuts they made to that block before rearranging the segments
- 3rd photo of the reassembled block segments, re-sewn, or if you are short on time, just photographed with the segments rearranged into the final format

AFTER the March 12th Virtual Tuesday meeting Lori and Brandie will collect these "reappeared blocks" and assemble them into children's quilts for Community Quilts. Hopefully we will have one or two finished quilts to showcase at the May guild meeting.

VIRTUAL TUESDAY TRANSITION

The current Virtual Tuesday format will end after the May 2024 session.

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Many, many thanks to Lucy Garvin, who hosted season 2021-2022, with a theme "Scraps and Scrappy" as another online connection during the pandemic lockdowns. Currently, Brandie and Lori have hosted seasons 2022-2023 and 2023-2024. The meeting was renamed "Virtual Tuesday" and the monthly sessions expanded into new topics but kept a strong tie to its scraps and scrappy origins.

By the numbers:

- 110+ on the recap mailing list
- Approximately averaging 65 members attending per session
- 3 outside guest contributors (Barb's Custom Quilting, PreQuilt, Fabric Spark)
- Approximately 24 sessions (almost 8 per season)

Ideas for the future:

- 1. Continue in a similar format with new hosts or a team of hosts (new hosts get to set their own format parameters. Lori and Brandie will definitely help with the behind-the-scenes activities so that it doesn't have to be completely reinvented.)
- 2. Reduce the number of sessions to 1 or 2 per year, hosted by Brandie & Lori, with member suggested content, no content requests no session! Think of this as a member-led workshop or panel discussion.
- 3. Change the monthly format to less content and more social, hosts rotate monthly so no one person is on the hook for each session every month. Very unstructured "themes" for the sewing time could include: a block design suggestion by dice roll or random draw; a goal of CQ destined output, one month is placemats, another is pillowcases; group collaboration on the president's challenge and other ideas suggested by members.

Benefits - Reasons to continue

- guild activity for out of town, remote members or members who can't make it to in person meetings
- low cost
- tie in with community quilts or quilt alongs already running
- guild community connections are reinforced

Cons - Reasons to discontinue

- pandemic is "over" and members don't want virtual sessions
- member led workshops are less professional or thorough perhaps
- no need for additional guild activities, there is already full calendar
- no one wants to host, or suggest content, so that is that!

We are not going to develop a survey. We would like for members to <u>email</u> us with their thoughts, suggestions, or advice! We will collate these responses and pass the results back to the group for a decision. And if no responses are forthcoming, then that means it will be discontinued at the end of the season, after May 2024.

In closing, there are no right or wrong answers, no hard feelings, things just run their course sometimes and then there is space for new ideas to pop up! We have had a lot of fun doing these sessions and it has been so rewarding.
