

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# New York Beauty Quiltalong

Join Becky F, and your friends from the guild, for a New York Beauty Quiltalong (see photo below for an example). We will meet, via Zoom, at 10 am during our virtual sew days on the second Saturday of the month, beginning October 12.

This project is flexible! You can work with 10 free New York Beauty blocks available online, design your own blocks, or choose blocks from another source. You can make any project you'd like: a set of placemats, a table runner, a throw, or a king size quilt. The New York Beauty quilt is traditionally made using foundation paper-piecing, but Becky will share resources for paperless (or freezer-paper) paper piecing, hand piecing, and machine embroidery.

If you would like to work from an NYB pattern or NYB-similar pattern, you can do so. There are many available. EQ8 users can choose from the extensive collection of New York Beauty blocks in the Block Library to design their own project, and Becky will host a special EQ8 tutorial session for EQ8 owners (or the EQ-curious) to learn more about how this software can help you plan and make your quilt.

For our December and January meetings, Sharon N-G will take the reins as she guides the group through Fat Quarter Flowers, a shortcut pattern from the Fat Quarter Shop. This pattern begins with the simple half-square triangle which is cut up and reassembled into a floral delight! Download the free pattern at https://www.fatquartershop.com/fat-quarter-flowers-quilt and choose from several sizes ranging from crib to twin. #### **Home for Good**

In September, we shared with members that the Home for Good campaign will open two transitional housing units with a total of 40 beds this year. Project partners were amazed by the quilts we contributed last year and are looking forward to our ongoing involvement. We are fortunate to have the ongoing financial support of Guelph Lions Club as well as that of an anonymous donor. Funding is used to purchase backing and batting for quilt tops you make. To get batting or backing, reach out to Becky F or Ann J.

All lap- and throw-sized quilts or quilt tops are welcome, but because adult males make up two-thirds of the homeless population, generously-sized quilts will be especially suitable for this project. As a general guideline, we recommend quilts approximately 60 x 80 inches in size. As always, sizes will vary based on the quilt's design.

Fast and friendly quilts are deeply appreciated. Your scraps and strings can make gorgeous quilts.



#### **Book Reviews**



Don't discard your tiny scraps or 'crumbs': Author Emily Bailey shows you how to quickly piece together small scraps to create larger pieces of "crumb fabric", using chain piecing to build up the fabric. Emily shares her tips and tricks for how to group fabric colours and prints in order to get the best results. There are step-by-step instructions for 15 stunning quilted projects, from full-size bed quilts to smaller projects including a pillow and pin cushion. One quilt, Under The Sea, features scrappy sea creatures and another, Night Sky, uses crumbs to create a richly textured background with crumb appliqué for the stars and planets. So why not take another look at your own stash of crumbs and get patchwork and quilting the zero-waste way!



Use just one, two or three simple repeated shapes:

This is a complete guide to making gorgeous scrap quilts using just one, two or three simple repeated shapes. Author Elsie M. Campbell uses triangles, clamshells, half-hexagons, strips and diamonds to make nine start-to-finish, stash-busting projects, from stunning table runners to a gorgeous king-sized quilt. Learn fearless stitching of Y-seams and curved pieces. With simplicity as the basis for each piece or block, Elsie shows how colour, value and contrast can work together.

Show. If you've shown an item somewhere else, it's still welcome at IQD. Most of our attendees will not have seen it.


The following information about your entry will be required:



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


